What are Corporate Joint Committees (CJCs)?

CJCs are regional bodies that have been established in Wales to improve economic prosperity throughout the areas they cover for the benefit of residents and businesses. Here in South West Wales, our CJC (SWWCJC) covers Carmarthenshire, Neath Port Talbot, Pembrokeshire and Swansea. In respect of some development planning functions, both Pembrokeshire National Park and Brecon Beacons National Park are also members.

The SWWCJC is working to ensure regional alignment in a number of key sectors to make the most of shared strengths and opportunities. This will help create more jobs in South West Wales, while also helping the region further cut its carbon footprint and attract more investment in future. Formally created in January 2022, the SWWCJC includes the Leaders of Carmarthenshire Council, Neath Port Talbot Council, Pembrokeshire Council and Swansea Council, as well as senior representatives of The Brecon Beacons and Pembrokeshire National Park authorities. Introduced by the Local Government and Elections (Wales) Act 2021, the SWWCJC is one of four such bodies in Wales.

What do we want to achieve?

The SWWCJC aims to deliver its vison for 'South West Wales 2035'.

Over the next five years, it will build on strong regional partnership arrangements already in place to make progress in key areas including:

- Further developing regional strategic planning for transport;
- Delivering regional aspirations for energy and economic development, and
- Preparations for the region's first ever strategic development plan.

Three well-being objectives have been set to guide the SWWCJC's initial work, although these will be reviewed as its work matures to ensure they're continuously fit for purpose.

What is the Corporate Plan?

The Plan includes a 2035 vision, three well-being objectives, and the sectors that the SWWCJC is focusing on. The Plan will guide the work of the SWWCJC and enable progress to be regularly monitored and evaluated. Between January 26 and March 8 2023, the SWWCJC consulted upon the Corporate Plan in draft form. On 30 of March 2023, the SWWCJC Members looked at the comments received as a result of the consultation before approving the Corporate Plan in its final form.

We all have a shared interest in making our region more enterprising, ambitious and sustainable. Realising these goals is important to people now, while also helping leave a positive long-term legacy for future generations.
